The Guildhall Singers would like to thank Father Adrian for welcoming us back to the beautiful All Saints Church.

Join us for an enchanting evening of choral music as we celebrate the 200th anniversary of Anton Bruckner's birth. We will immerse you in a serene and spiritual soundscape, beginning with the mystical plainchant of Hildegard von Bingen, the visionary 12th-century abbess.

We continue our concert with two works by Norwegian composers who, like Bruckner, were inspired by monastic chant: Ola Gjeilo's mesmerising *Ave generosa*, which draws on the text of Hildegard von Bingen, and Edvard Grieg's *Ave maris stella*, based on a 9th-century hymn.

At the heart of the program are some of Bruckner's most soul-stirring *a cappella* motets, including his radiant *Virga Jesse floruit*, a Christmas gem that exudes a deep sense of reverence and quiet grandeur.

Our concert will also feature a selection of seasonal favourites from Europe and the New World, resonating with the warmth of the festive season.

Step into a world of glowing candlelight and the comforting warmth of mulled wine, creating a magical atmosphere to complement these transcendent choral works. Let the purity of these voices lift your spirits and fill you with peace in the heart of the holiday season.

The Guildhall Singers:

Singing a range of religious and secular music, from early to Baroque, folk to jazz, Renaissance to contemporary, the Guildhall Singers were formed in 2019 as a group of experienced local singers by Helen Herbert. "We wanted to have our own ensemble so we could choose music from a repertoire that is especially suited to a smaller group." Following their first concert in 2019 in support of the Bungalow project at St Faith's, Gaywood, the choir took part in the 'for one night only' 11th Hour Project, singing at several well-known venues in King's Lynn. It also performed in Christmas concerts supporting the Shakespeare's Guildhall Trust, True's Yard and twice for the Mayor's Trust: at the Town Hall with UK jazz legend Norma Winstone and at Ken Hill House. Performing in St Peter's, Great Walsingham as well as St Mary's, South Wootton the choir thrived under the expertise of Charlotte Sinassi-Hill, before she passed the baton on to renowned singer and voice coach Andrés Hernandez-Salazar.
